**Stem** – the verb minus the –ar, -er, or –ir ending

**Present Tense** – happening now

**Subject Pronouns**

Yo – I

Tú – You familiar

Él – He

Ella – She

Ud. – You formal

Nosotros/Nosotras – We

Vosotros/Vosotras – You all (España)

Ellos/Ellas – They

Uds. – You all

**All of the Forms of You**

Tú – you familiar – used when speaking to loved ones and anyone on a first name basis

Usted (Ud.) – you formal – used when speaking to someone with a title, a stranger, very respectful

Ustedes (Uds.) – you all, you plural, used when speaking to more than one person

Vosotros/Vosotras – you all, you plural – USED ONLY IN SPAIN

**Pronoun Substitutions**

Ana – ella

Miguel - El

Paco y yo – Nosotros

Tú y yo – Nosotros

Ud. y yo - Nosotros

Maria y tú – Uds.

Ana y Sara – ellas

Ana y su amiga – ellas

El profesor y su estudiante – ellos

Mi mamá y mi papá - ellos

Los animales – ellos

Los carros – ellos

El papel – él/ella (it)

**Present Tense –ar Verb Endings**

Yo → o      Nosotros(as) → amos

Tú → as      Vosotros(as) → áis

Ud, Él, Ella → a      Uds, Ellos, Ellas → an

**Hablo                  Hablamos**

**Hablas                Habláis**

**Habla                 Hablan**

**Hablo – I speak, I do speak, I am speaking**
